The Ministry of Corporate Affairs ("MCA") has, vide its General Circular No. 3 dated September 22, 2025 read together with circulars dated April 8, 2020, April 13, 2020, May 5, 2020, January 13, 2021, December 8, 2021, December 14, 2021, May 5, 2022, December 28, 2022, September 25, 2023 and September 19, 2024 (collectively referred to as "MCA Circulars") has permitted the holding of the Annual General Meeting through Video Conferencing ("VC") or through other Audio-Visual Means ("OAVM"), without the physical presence of the Members at a common venue. Pursuant to MCA Circulars, since this AGM is being held through VC/OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of Proxies by the Members will not be available for the AGM and hence the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to this Notice. Further since the Meeting will be held by VC/OAVM, the requirement of attaching route map for the AGM to the Notice is not applicable.

In compliance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("Listing Regulations") and MCA Circulars, the 42nd Annual General Meeting ("Meeting" or "AGM") of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM on Monday, 28th day of September, 2026 at 11:30 am. (IST). The proceedings of the AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company situated at 195, Walkeshwar Road, Mumbai 400 006.

2. Institutional Investors, who are Members of the Company, are encouraged to attend and vote at the AGM through VC/OAVM facility. Corporate Members/Institutional Investors (i.e. other than individuals, HUFs, NRIs etc.) who are intending to appoint their authorized representatives pursuant to Sections 112 and 113 of the Act, as the case may be, to attend the AGM through VC or OAVM or to vote through remote e-voting are requested to send a certified copy of the Board Resolution or authorisation to the Scrutinizer by e-mail at pushpal@mpsanghavi.com with a copy marked to cs.stcl2022@gmail.com
3. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Act.
4. Relevant details pursuant to Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI Listing Regulations and the Secretarial Standards on General Meetings (SS-2) as laid down by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India and notified by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, in respect of Director(s) seeking appointment/ reappointment/fixation of remuneration of Directors at this AGM are also annexed to this Notice as **Annexure-A**.
5. Submission of questions or queries prior to AGM/ Registration of Speakers: Members who would like to express their views or ask questions during the AGM may register themselves as a speaker, during the period from Tuesday the 15th day of September, 2026 to Wednesday, the 23rd day of September, 2026 by sending email to cs.stcl2022@gmail.com Such questions shall be taken up during the meeting or replied by the Chairman of the Meeting suitably. Members who would like to express their views or ask questions during the AGM may register themselves as speaker by sending their request from their registered e-mail address mentioning their name, DP ID and client ID/Folio no, No. of shares, PAN, mobile number to cs.stcl2022@gmail.com on or before Wednesday, the 23rd day of September, 2026. Those Members who have registered themselves as a speaker will be allowed to express their views, ask questions during the AGM. The Company reserves the right to restrict the number of speakers as well as the speaking time depending upon the availability of time at the AGM.
6. In line with the MCA Circulars, the notice of the 42nd AGM along with the Annual Report for FY 2025-26 are being sent only by electronic mode to those Members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Company/ Depositories. 7. 8. Mandatory Linkage of PAN with Aadhaar: SEBI has vide its Circulars mandated furnishing of details of PAN, email address, mobile number, bank account and nomination by shareholders holding securities in physical form. Further, it has also been stated that folios wherein any one of the cited document / details are not furnished or made available, the relevant folio(s) shall be frozen by the Registrars and Transfer Agent of the Company (RTA). Keeping the above statutory requirements in view, members holding shares in physical form are requested to furnish valid PAN, KYC details, Bank details, Nomination details etc. immediately to the Company/RTA, to ensure that their folios are not frozen. Members holding shares in electronic (DEMAT) form are requested to verify and update immediately any changes in their address or bank database etc., to their respective Depository Participants with whom they are maintaining their demat accounts. 9. To prevent fraudulent transactions, members are advised to exercise due diligence and notify the Company of any change in address/e-mail id or staying abroad or demise of any members as soon as possible. Periodic statement of holdings should be obtained from the concerned Depository Participants and holdings should be verified.
10. Members who hold shares in physical form in multiple folios in identical names or joint accounts in the same order of names are requested to send share certificates to the Company for consolidation into a single folio. Members who hold shares in physical form are advised to convert their shareholding in dematerialized form with any depository participant.

12. General instructions for accessing and participating in the AGM through VC/OAVM Facility - Members can join the AGM via VC/OAVM mode 30 minutes before and 15 minutes after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available for 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee etc., who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis. 13. The Board of Directors have appointed FCS Pushpal Sanghavi, Partner of M/s. M P Sanghavi & Associates LLP, Company Secretaries (holding ICSI Certificate of Practice No. 22908) as Scrutinizer to scrutinize the remote e-voting process and voting through E-Voting system at the AGM in a fair and transparent manner.
14. In compliance with the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 and in pursuance to Regulation 44 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and Secretarial Standards on General Meeting issued by Institute of Company Secretaries of India, your Company is providing facility of remote e-voting to its Members in respect of all the businesses to be transacted in the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has engaged M/s. MUFG Intime India Private Limited (Formerly Link Intime India Private

Limited) ('MUFG') for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorised agency. The facility of casting votes by members using remote e-voting system as well as e-voting on the date of AGM will be provided by MUFG.

15. The remote E-Voting period for all business items contained in this notice of AGM shall commence from Friday the 25th day of September 2026 at 09:00 A.M. (IST) and will end on Sunday the 27th day of September 2026 at 05:00 PM. (IST). The remote E-Voting module shall be disabled by MUFG for voting thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by any Member, he/she shall not be allowed to change it subsequently.
16. The cut-off date for determining the eligibility of shareholders to exercise remote E-Voting rights and attendance at AGM is Monday, 21st day of September 2026. A person, whose name is recorded in the Register of Members or in the Register of Beneficial Owners maintained by the Depositories as on the abovementioned cut-off date, shall be entitled to avail the facility of remote E-Voting or voting at the meeting through electronic mode. The voting rights of shareholders shall be in proportion to their shares of the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date. A person who is not a Member as on the cut-off date should treat this Notice for information purpose only.
17. Those Members who attend the AGM and have not cast their vote on the Resolutions through remote e-voting and are otherwise not barred from doing so, shall be eligible to vote through e-voting system during the AGM. The Members who have cast their vote by remote e-voting prior to the AGM may also attend/participate in the AGM but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again. Members are requested to carefully read the instructions for E-Voting before casting their vote.
18. At the AGM, the Chairman of the meeting shall after discussion on the resolutions on which voting is to be held, allow voting by electronic means to all those members who attend the meeting but have not casted their votes by availing the remote E-Voting facility.
19. The Scrutinizer shall, immediately after the conclusion of voting at the AGM will first download the votes cast at the meeting and thereafter unblock the votes cast through remote E-Voting in the presence of at least 2 (two) witnesses not in the employment of the Company. Thereafter the Scrutinizer shall, submit a consolidated Scrutinizer's report of the total votes cast in favour or against, if any, to the Chairman or the Company Secretary who shall countersign the same and declare the result of voting forthwith. The result of e-voting along with consolidated Scrutinizer's report will be declared upon conclusion of the Meeting, within the permissible timelines.
20. The results declared along with the Scrutinizer's report shall be placed on the website of the Company viz. www.stcl.co.in and shall also be communicated to the Stock Exchange. The Resolutions, if approved, shall be deemed to be passed, on the date of AGM.

There have been no material changes and commitments that have occurred after close of the financial year till the date of this report, which affect the financial position of the Company.

CHANGE IN NATURE OF BUSINESS

During the Financial Year 2025-26, the Company resumed trading in yarn and other textile products and leasing of properties, in addition to continuing its existing Real Estate Development business. These activities are in accordance with the Objects Clause of the Memorandum of Association of the Company. Accordingly, the Company is presently engaged in three major business segments viz. Real Estate Development, Trading of Yarn and other Textile Products, and Leasing of Properties.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS & STATE OF AFFAIRS

During FY 25-26 your Company's Standalone Operating Revenue was Rs. 232.63 Lakhs as against Rs. 26.69 Lakhs in the previous year. Standalone operations during the year resulted in Net Profit (before tax) of Rs. 1.24 Lakhs against Net Profit (before tax) of Rs. 6.97 Lakhs in the previous year. Consolidated operations of the Company during the year, comprising of the financials of the Company and Ssavai - Smart Abodes LLP (a 95% Subsidiary), resulted in Operating revenue of Rs. 232.63 Lakhs as against Operating revenue of Rs. 26.69 Lakhs in the previous year and Net Profit (before tax) of Rs. 0.21 Lakhs as against Net Profit (before tax) of Rs. 4.02 Lakhs during previous year.

TRANSFER TO RESERVES & DIVIDEND

During the year under review, there was no amount transferred to General Reserves. Further to in view of carry forward losses and to conserve resources for future expansion, your Board does not recommend any dividend for FY 2025-26.

CAPITAL STRUCTURE

There was no change in Capital Structure of the Company during the year either by way of issuance or buy-back or otherwise. Company's Paid-up Capital as at March 31, 2026 was Rs. 6,36,62,410/- comprising of 3,18,31,205 Equity Shares of Rs. 2 each. The Equity Shares of the Company are listed on BSE Limited (Stock Code 514197). Further, the Equity Shares are available for dematerialization under ISIN INE110Q01023 with both the Depositories. As at March 31, 2026, 81.15% of Paid-up Capital of the Company is held in Demat Mode. Further, the entire shareholding of the Promoter, except 230 Equity Shares held by an entity erroneously reported as Promoter group entity in the past, are held in Demat Mode. The Company has paid requisite Listing Fees for FY 2026-27 to BSE Ltd.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

As per Regulation 15(2) of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ('SEBI Listing Regulations') the Corporate Governance provisions as specified in Regulations 17 to 27; Regulation 46(2)(b) to (i) and (t) and Para C, D and E of Schedule V of the SEBI Listing Regulations shall not apply to the Company. However relevant Corporate Governance disclosures are appropriately included in this report. Mr. Dhaval Ajay Savai and Mr. Tejas Hasmukh Shah and three (3) Independent Directors viz Mr. Pramit Mahendra Shah, Mr. Nipun Kesharichand Zaveri and Mr. Ketan Vinay Shah. MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

INDIAN ECONOMY

The Indian economy continued to demonstrate resilience and strong growth momentum during the year. According to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Annual Report 2025-26, India remains one of the fastest-growing major economies globally, supported by robust domestic demand, healthy corporate and banking sector balance sheets, sustained capital expenditure, and continued policy reforms. The RBI has projected real GDP growth of 6.9% for FY 2026-27, reflecting confidence in the country's macroeconomic fundamentals despite global uncertainties. India's economic outlook continues to be supported by infrastructure development, digital transformation, manufacturing expansion, and increasing investment activity. While geopolitical developments, volatility in global commodity prices, and external economic conditions may pose certain challenges, the country's strong domestic growth drivers and sound financial system are expected to support sustainable long-term economic growth.

The real estate sector witnessed continued momentum, driven by increased demand for residential and commercial properties, supportive regulatory measures, and improved investor confidence. The textile sector also experienced stable demand, supported by domestic consumption and export opportunities, while the commercial leasing market remained steady with growing demand for quality assets.

During the year, the Company continued its business in Real Estate Development and restarted its business activities of trading in yarn and other textile products and leasing of properties, in accordance with the objects contained in its Memorandum of Association. The diversification of business activities is expected to strengthen the Company's revenue base and improve long-term growth prospects.

BUSINESS OVERVIEW

The Company is presently engaged in the following business activities viz. Real Estate Development; Trading in Yarn and Other Textile Products; and Leasing of Properties.

The expansion of business activities during the year represents an important strategic step towards diversifying the Company's operations and reducing dependence on a single source of revenue.

REAL ESTATE SECTOR

The Indian real estate and infrastructure sector continues to play a pivotal role in the country's economic growth and urban transformation. Supported by sustained government investment, policy reforms, and increasing private sector participation, the sector has witnessed steady growth across residential, commercial, industrial, and logistics segments.

The Government of India's continued emphasis on infrastructure development through initiatives such as PM Gati Shakti, the National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP), Smart Cities Mission, metro rail expansion, affordable housing programmes, and multimodal connectivity projects is expected to accelerate urbanisation and improve economic efficiency. The Union Budget 2026-27 further strengthened the sector by increasing capital expenditure on

infrastructure and prioritising investments in transportation, logistics, housing, and urban development.

The residential real estate market continues to benefit from rising income levels, growing urbanisation, favourable demographics, and increasing demand for quality housing. Commercial real estate has also demonstrated resilience, driven by growth in the services sector, Global Capability Centres (GCCs), and demand for office and warehousing spaces.

While challenges such as interest rate movements, input cost fluctuations, and global economic uncertainties remain, the long-term outlook for the Indian real estate and infrastructure sector remains positive, supported by strong economic fundamentals, government policy support, and increasing investment activity.

TEXTILE TRADING SECTOR

India continues to be one of the world's largest producers and consumers of textiles, with the sector contributing significantly to the country's industrial output, exports, and employment. The industry benefits from a strong domestic manufacturing base, an integrated value chain, increasing consumer demand, and supportive government initiatives aimed at enhancing global competitiveness.

The Government of India has introduced various measures, including the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Textiles, PM MITRA Parks Scheme, and initiatives to promote technical textiles and exports. These measures are expected to strengthen the textile value chain, improve manufacturing capabilities, and create new business opportunities for market participants.

The yarn and textile trading business continues to benefit from growing domestic consumption, expanding organised retail, increasing demand from the apparel and home furnishing industries, and improving supply chain efficiencies. However, the sector remains exposed to fluctuations in raw material prices, changes in global demand, foreign exchange movements, and evolving trade policies.

The long-term outlook for the textile sector remains encouraging, supported by favourable demographics, rising disposable incomes, increasing exports, and continued government support for the industry.

LEASING OF PROPERTIES

The Income in this segment includes rental income earned on one of the immovable property leased out by the Company, for generating additional source of revenue.

OPPORTUNITIES AND OUTLOOK

The Company believes that the Indian real estate sector continues to offer promising opportunities due to urbanization, infrastructure development, favourable government initiatives, and increasing housing demand. Simultaneously, the textile trading business presents opportunities arising from expanding domestic consumption and improved supply chain efficiencies.

THREATS AND CHALLENGES

The Indian real estate sector continues to face certain challenges despite its strong long-term growth potential. Rising land acquisition costs, increasing prices of key construction materials such as steel, cement, and energy, and fluctuations in borrowing costs may impact project viability and profitability. Any increase in interest rates may affect housing affordability and moderate demand in certain market segments. The sector is also subject to regulatory and compliance requirements, including environmental clearances, land-related approvals, and other statutory permissions. Delays in obtaining approvals or changes in regulatory policies may impact project timelines and increase development costs. Additionally, the sector remains exposed to macroeconomic uncertainties, geopolitical developments, and volatility in commodity prices, which may affect investor sentiment and business confidence. The availability of skilled labour, adoption of modern construction technologies, and increasing focus on sustainability and green building standards also present operational challenges for developers.

Further, intensifying competition among organised developers and changing consumer preferences require continuous innovation, efficient project execution, and enhanced customer engagement. Despite these challenges, favourable demographics, rapid urbanisation, infrastructure development, and supportive government policies continue to provide a strong foundation for the long-term growth of the Indian real estate sector.

HUMAN RESOURCES / INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

As on March 31, 2026, the Company had 8 permanent employees on its rolls. During the financial year under review, there were no material developments in the Human Resources / Industrial Relations front which had a significant impact on the operations of the Company.

INTERNAL CONTROL & ADEQUACY

The Company has in place adequate internal control systems and internal financial controls commensurate with the nature, size, and complexity of its operations. These controls are designed to ensure the orderly and efficient conduct of business, safeguarding of assets, accuracy and reliability of financial reporting, compliance with applicable laws and regulations, and effective risk management. The internal control systems are periodically reviewed to ensure their adequacy and effectiveness, and no material weaknesses were observed during the year under review.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE:

The Company had in response to communication received from the Stock Exchange i.e. BSE Limited, paid Fine of Rs. 24,780/- in connection with said delayed filing.*

We further report that compliance with applicable financial laws including Direct and Indirect Tax laws by the Company has not been reviewed in this Audit since the same has been subject to review by the Statutory Auditors and other designated professionals.

We further report that:

As at March 31, 2026, the Board of Directors of the Company was duly constituted with proper balance of Executive Directors, Non-Executive Directors and Independent Directors. The changes in composition of the Board of Directors that took place during the period under review were carried out in compliance with the provisions of the Act.

Except for the meeting(s) held at shorter notice, adequate notice was given to all directors to schedule the Board Meetings, agenda and detailed notes on agenda were sent at least seven days in advance and a system exists for seeking and obtaining further information and clarifications on the agenda items before the meeting for meaningful participation at the meeting.

As represented by the Management and recorded in the Minutes, the decision at the Board Meetings and Meetings of Board Committees were taken unanimously.

(ii) During the year Company re-commenced Textile and Yarn trading business and consequently as at March 31, 2026.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES ON STANDALONE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

A. Significant Accounting Policies

1 Basis of accounting:-

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time, and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. 2 Use of Estimates

Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

3 Revenue Recognition

Expenses and Income considered payable and receivable respectively are accounted for on accrual basis. Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

4 Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, Plant & Equipment including intangible assets are stated at their original cost of acquisition including taxes, freight and other incidental expenses related to acquisition and installation of the concerned assets less depreciation till date. Company has adopted cost model for all class of items of Property Plant and Equipment.

5 Depreciation

Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided to the extent of depreciable amount on the Written down Value (WDV) Method/SLM method. Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation on assets acquired/sold during the year is recognised on a pro-rata basis to the statement of profit and loss till the date of acquisition/sale.

The carrying amount of assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the assets, net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risks specific to the asset.

After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset over its remaining useful life.

6 Foreign currency Transaction

Transactions arising in foreign currencies during the year are converted at the rates closely approximating the rates ruling on the transaction dates. Liabilities and receivables in foreign currency are restated at the year-end exchange rates. All exchange rate differences arising from conversion in terms of the above are included in the statement of profit and loss.

7 Investments

Investments, which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year. From the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as non-current investments. Current investments are carried in the financial statements at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminutions in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of profit and loss.

8 Inventories

Inventories are valued as under:-

- 1 Inventories : Lower of cost(FIFO/specific cost/Weighted avg) or net realizable value.
- 2 Scrap : At net realizable value

9 Borrowing cost

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of the qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying assets is one that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended uses or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue in the year of incurrence.

10 Retirement Benefits

The retirement benefits are accounted for as and when liability becomes due for payment.

11 Taxes on Income

Provision for current tax is made on the basis of estimated taxable income for the current accounting year in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961. The deferred tax for timing differences between the book and tax profits for the year is accounted for, using the tax rates and laws that have been substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences are recognized to the extent there is virtual certainty with convincing evidence that these would be realized in future. At each Balance Sheet date, the carrying amount of deferred tax is reviewed to reassure realization.

12 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:- (AS-29)

Provisions are recognized only when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and when a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation can be made.

Contingent Liabilities is disclosed in Notes to the account for:-

- (i) Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the company or

- (ii) Present Obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statement since this may result in the recognition of the income that may never be realized.

13 General

Except wherever stated, accounting policies are consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles and have been consistently applied.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES ON CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

A. Significant Accounting Policies

1 Basis of accounting:-

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time, and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis, except for those assets and liabilities which are required to be measured at fair value in accordance with the applicable Ind AS.

2 Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

3 Revenue Recognition

Expenses and Income considered payable and receivable respectively are accounted for on accrual basis. Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

4 Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, Plant & Equipment including intangible assets are stated at their original cost of acquisition including taxes, freight and other incidental expenses related to acquisition and installation of the concerned assets less depreciation till date. Company has adopted cost model for all class of items of Property Plant and Equipment.

5 Depreciation

Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided to the extent of depreciable amount on the Written down Value (WDV) Method/SLM method. Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation on assets acquired/sold during the year is recognised on a pro-rata basis to the statement of profit and loss till the date of acquisition/sale.

The carrying amount of assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the assets, net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risks specific to the asset.

After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset over its remaining useful life.

6 Foreign currency Transaction

Transactions arising in foreign currencies during the year are converted at the rates closely approximating the rates ruling on the transaction dates. Liabilities and receivables in foreign currency are restated at the year-end exchange rates. All exchange rate differences arising from conversion in terms of the above are included in the statement of profit and loss.

7 Investments

Investments, which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year. From the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as non-current investments. Current investments are carried in the financial statements at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminutions in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of profit and loss.

8 Inventories

Inventories are valued as under:-

- 1 Inventories : Lower of cost(FIFO/specific cost/Weighted avg) or net realizable value.
- 2 Scrap : At net realizable value

9 Borrowing cost

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of the qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying assets is one that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended uses or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue in the year of incurrence.

10 Retirement Benefits

The retirement benefits are accounted for as and when liability becomes due for payment.

11 Taxes on Income

Provision for current tax is made on the basis of estimated taxable income for the current accounting year in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961. The deferred tax for timing differences between the book and tax profits for the year is accounted for, using the tax rates and laws that have been substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences are recognized to the extent there is virtual certainty with convincing evidence that these would be realized in future. At each Balance Sheet date, the carrying amount of deferred tax is reviewed to reassure realization.

12 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:- (AS-29)

Provisions are recognized only when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and when a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation can be made.

Contingent Liabilities is disclosed in Notes to the account for:-

- (i) Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the company or

- (ii) Present Obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statement since this may result in the recognition of the income that may never be realized.

13 General

Except wherever stated, accounting policies are consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles and have been consistently applied.
